Command & Control of Wildland Urban Interface Fire Operations for the Structural Chief

March 28-29, 2020

Course Description

This two-day course is designed to provide students with the essential tools and skills to operate safely in a wildland/wildland urban interface incident. Course content covers interface incidents, fire behavior, safety and operational considerations.

Student Qualifications (Primary and Secondary Audience)

This course is designed for Chief or Company Officers who may have command responsibility for multiple resources at the scene of a wildland/urban interface incident.

Course Scope (Goal)

The goal of this course is to provide the tools for the initial Incident Commander (IC), to include sizing up the incident, evaluating fire behavior, implementing strategies and tactics, establishing command structure, and deploying resources. The purpose of this course is to provide basic decision-making information for fire operations in the WUI for the initial IC. Students may not want to attend this course if they have already attended:

- "S130 — Wildland Firefighting Training"
- "S190 — Introduction to Wildland Fire Behavior"
